Walking Trails

Arroyo Trabuco Trail (15 miles)

- Mountain to sea trail; travel through Trabuco Canyon to the Pacific Ocean
- This trail is heavily wooded with lots of wildlife, picturesque mountain views, and the sounds of a flowing stream.

Difficulty: Fast and easy

Oso Creek Trail (5.5 miles of total trails)

- Oso Creek Trail offers residents hiking trails in the heart of Mission Viejo.
- During the development of Mission Viejo many rare fossils were uncovered along Oso Creek.
- The Oso Creek's edge has been replanted with natural vegetation that occurs along natural riparian streams.
- Many species of wildlife use the Oso Creek.

Difficulty: Easy/Moderate/Difficult

Mission Viejo Lake Trail (3.1mile loop around Lake Mission Viejo)

- Enjoy scenic views of the lake as you walk, jog, run or even bike this trail.
- Many activities can be seen such as boating, fishing and more.

Difficulty: Smoothly paved

Wilderness Glen Trail (2.1 miles of trails)

- The trails in the Wilderness Glen follow the semi-wilderness area that is adjacent to a tributary of the Aliso Creek.
- Mature trees can be found along Wilderness Glen.
- An important habitat for local wildlife.

Difficulty: Trails range from paved, to level dirt, to unmaintained uneven sections.

Aliso Creek Trail (18.5 miles)

- Enjoy riding or hiking this trail with easy access at the trailhead.
- This trail passes through Mission Viejo from South Laguna to Rancho Santa Margarita.
- This trail has plenty of rest areas and kiosks providing information and history.
- Snakes, squirrels, rabbits, deer, bobcats and birds can be found on the this trail.

Difficulty: Moderate
