Commission Green Lights New Entertainment, Trampoline Facility in Mission Viejo Freeway Center

The City’s Planning and Transportation Commission this week gave the green light to CircusTrix to open a new indoor entertainment and trampoline center dubbed “Hawktopus” in the Mission Viejo Freeway Center.

Hawktopus is expected to open in November in the 30,054-square-foot building at 25222 El Paseo that used to house Borders Books and Wicks Furniture. The business is an indoor trampoline/recreation park that features an aerial ninja obstacle course, foam pits, slackline, trampoline wall, parkour obstacles and trampoline dodgeball. The facility will offer party rooms with a reservation. The business will be open Monday through Thursday from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m., Friday and Saturday from 9 a.m. to midnight and closed to the general public on Sunday to accommodate birthday parties and corporate events.



Free Document Shredding Event Sept. 17

Mission Viejo Police Services and the City are giving community members the chance to destroy their sensitive documents on Saturday, September 17. The free drive-through shredding event is from 8 a.m. to noon in the Mission Viejo High School parking lot at 25025 Chrisanta Drive. Identity theft is one of the fastest-growing crimes in the nation, and shredding documents with personal or financial information can be an effective measure of prevention.

Mission Viejo residents and businesses can bring up to 10 legal-size boxes of paper records – cancelled checks, pay stubs, credit card statements and more – for immediate shredding by Orange County Shredding. Mission Viejo Ranked Among 20 Wealthiest U.S. Cities

Mission Viejo is ranked among the 20 wealthiest large cities in the nation, according to a new study. NerdWallet studied 475 cities with populations of 65,000 or more to compile its rankings based on a broad definition of wealth: high levels of median household income, median home values, percentage of homes without mortgages and average credit scores.

With a median income of \$151,370, Palo Alto took the top spot. Homes in this Santa Clara County city cost a median \$2.5 million, and 34 percent have no mortgage. Residents had average credit limits of \$71,696. Mission Viejo, a picturesque city of nearly 100,000 people, ranked 16th with a median income of \$103,607; homes costing a median \$659,600 – 21 percent mortgage-free, and \$57,869 credit limits. Other Orange County cities included in the ranking are Newport Beach, Yorba Linda, Laguna Niguel and San Clemente.
