ANYONE CAN ACT AS AN IMMEDIATE RESPONDER AND SAVE LIVES WITH THIS TRAINING.

LEARN IMPORTANT BASICS TO HELP WITH THE SURVIVAL OF A VICTIM WHO IS BLEEDING. Massive bleeding can occur from various causes, but especially from an active shooter or explosive event. Victims can quickly die from uncontrolled bleeding if not attended to within 5 to 10 minutes.

Similar to how the general public has learned to perform CPR, we must learn proper bleeding control techniques, including use of hands, dressing and a tourniquet.

Stop the bleed program was initiated by the American College of Surgeons and the Hartford Consensus and is taught by Mission Hospital's trauma team. A certification of completion and a take home reference booklet is included.



Join us for this Educational Class and Prizes Raffles **Trauma Awareness Event !**


Learn important basics on how you could help with the survival

of a victim who is bleeding



Who should take this class, and why? Massive bleeding can occur from any cause, but particularly from an active shooter or explosive event where a response is delayed can result in death. Similar to how the general public has learned and performs CPR, we must learn proper bleeding control techniques, including how to use their hands, dressings, and tourniquets. Victims can quickly die from uncontrolled bleeding, within five to 10 minutes.

However, anyone at the scene can act as immediate responder and save lives if they know what to do. Stop the Bleed program educates participants about general bleeding control initiated by the American College of Surgeons and the Hartford Consensus. Mission Hospital Trauma team members lead this course, which will include hands on skill stations, video information, and a certificate upon completion. Recommended for ages 18 and up.
