The City of Mission Viejo was incorporated March 31, 1988, becoming Orange County's 27th city. Any election materials leading to that point are on file at the County of Orange Registrar of Voters.

Shall the order adopted on July 22, 1987, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Orange ordering a reorganization affecting the Mission Viejo Community Services District and providing for the incorporation of the City of Mission Viejo and the merging of the Mission Viejo Community Services District with the new City of Mission Viejo subject to the terms and conditions specified in the order, including the establishment of an appropriations limit for the City of Mission Viejo of \$35,000,000 and the continuance as city taxes of the sales and use tax, transient occupancy, the real property transfer tax, and other general taxes presently imposed by the county at the same rate as imposed by the county and using the same manner of collection, be confirmed?
